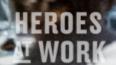

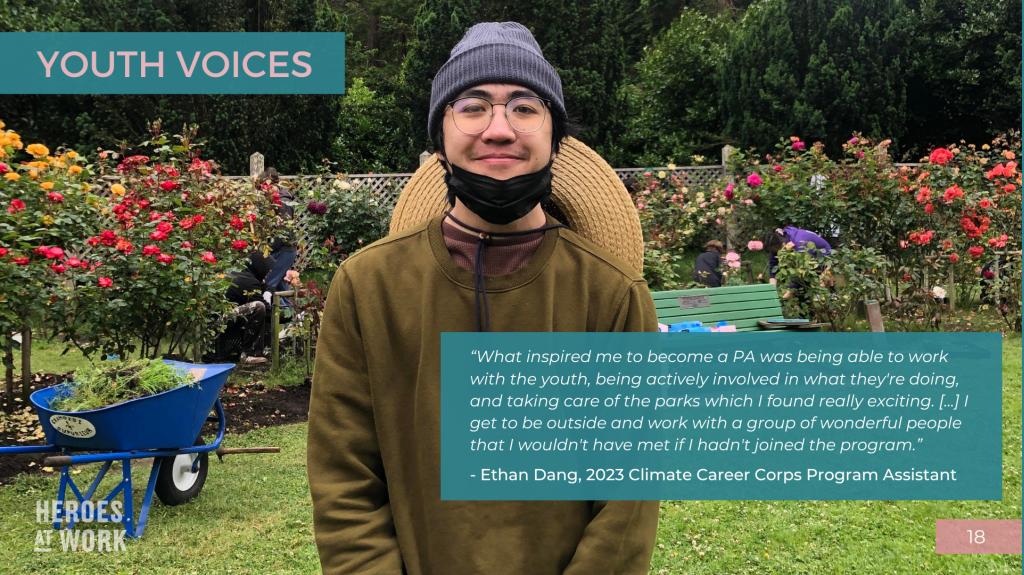
# **YOUTH VOICES**
